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7 DAYS / 6 NIGHTS NEPAL

03 Nights in Kathmandu, 02 Nights in Pokhara. 01 Night in Nagarkot

Day 01: Kuala Lumpur – Kathmandu (L / D)

Upon arrival at the Tribhuvan International Airport in Kathmandu, you will be greeted with welcome garland, sightseeing to **Patan Durbar Square**: - It is an enchanting mélange of palace buildings, artistic courtyards and graceful pagoda temples. This Square was the former Royal Palace Complex which was the center of Patan's religious and social life, and houses a museum containing an array of bronze status and religious monuments. One remarkable monument here is 17th Century temple dedicated to the Hindu god Krishna, built entirely of stone. Overnight at hotel in Kathmandu.

Day 02: Kathmandu – Nagarkot (B / L / D)

After breakfast, visit **Pashupatinath Temple**, with its astonishing architectural beauty, stands as a symbol of faith, religion, culture and tradition. Pashupatinath is regarded as one of the most sacred temple of Hindu Lord Shiva in the world and its existence dates back to 400 A.D. The richly-ornamented pagoda houses the sacred linga or phallic symbol of Lord Shiva. Thousands of pilgrims from all over the world come to pay homage to this temple that is also known as 'The Temple of Living Beings'. Only the Hindus are allowed to go inside the temple. **Next visit Boudhanath Stupa** lies about 6 km east of downtown Kathmandu and is the largest stupa in the Valley and one of the largest in the world. It looms 36 meters high and presents one of the most fascinating specimens of stupa design with hundreds of prayer wheels and 108 small images of Buddha all around. The stupa has four sides with the watchful eyes of Lord Buddha. All the Buddhists throng to this stupa to take part in the sacred rituals during the Buddhist festivals. Drive to Nagarkot, check in hotel, dinner and overnight at hotel in Kathmandu.

Day 03: Nagarkot – Kathmandu (B / L / D)

Early morning sunrise view, breakfast, drive to Kathmandu, visit **Bhaktapur Durbar Square**: - The Durbar Square (the palace complex) in the central part of Bhaktapur depicts the art and architecture of the Malla rule. The Palace of Fifty - five windows stand in the square was the home to many kings of Bhaktapur. Among other monuments around the Durbar Square are worth visiting. Next visit **Kathmandu Durbar Square**: This complex of palaces, courtyards and temples like Hanumandhoka Palace, Kumari Ghar (Abode of the Living Goddess), Taleju temple, built between the 12th and 18th centuries, used to be the seat of the ancient Malla Kings of Kathmandu. An intriguing piece here is the 17h -century stone inscription set into the wall of the palace with writings in 15 languages. The Durbar Square, protected as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is the social, religious and urban focal point of the city. Even to date, all the major state and social ceremonies, including the solemnization of coronations are performed in one of the courtyards in this complex. There are also museums inside the palace building. Overnight at hotel in Kathmandu.

Day 04: Kathmandu – Pokhara (B / L / D)

Breakfast, drive to Pokhara, check in hotel, lunch, Boating on Fewa Lake, visit Taal Barahi temple, free time at the Lakeside area, dinner and overnight at hotel in Pokhara.

Day 05: Pokhara (B / L / D)

Early morning drive to Sarangkot **(1590m)** to view the sunrise. From here, you can see a panoramic sweep of Himalayan peaks, from Dhaulagiri **(8167m)** in the west to the perfect pyramid that is Machhapuchhare **(6997m)** and the rounded peak of Annapurna II **(7937m)** in the east. The village of Sarangkot overlooks the city of Pokhara and its lake on the north-western outskirts of the city. Breakfast, Sightseeing tour of Pokhara which includes Devis Fall, Gupteshwor Cave, Bindhyabasini Temple and Tibetan Refugee Camp. Lunch, dinner and overnight at hotel in Pokhara.

Day 06: Pokhara – Kathmandu (B / L / D)

After breakfast, drive to Kathmandu visit Swoyambhunath Stupa watches over the Valley from the top of a hillock on its western side just three kilometers west of the city center. The stupa is one of the holiest Buddhist sites in Nepal and its establishment is linked to the creation of the Kathmandu Valley out of a primordial lake. Swayambhu is also known as Samhengu and is listed as a World Heritage Site. It is also one of the oldest and glorious Buddhist shrines in the world which is said to be two thousand years old. The four sides of the stupa are painted with the eyes of Lord Buddha and the stupa is also known as the watchful eyes of Buddha. The rest of the evening is free for shopping in the Thamel area followed by typical Nepali dinner with cultural show at a local restaurant. Overnight at hotel in Kathmandu.

Day 07: Kathmandu – Kuala Lumpur (B)

After breakfast, transfer to airport for final departure.
